# First Payable Deliverable: The PhmCAT

*The Population Health Management Capabilities Assessment Tool (PhmCAT) is the first deliverable that practices can receive payment for completing in the EPT program. The table below illustrates the timeline for payment.*

# PhmCAT Overview



A multi-domain assessment used to understand practice competencies and identify strengths and opportunities for development



Collaborative effort with DHCS, managed care plans, providers, and subject matter experts to develop an assessment that can be utilized across multiple CA programs/initiatives



Piloted assessment with practices in the PHMI to identify learnings and refine/evolve the assessment overtime

## Practices will use the assessment to:



Engage a multi-disciplinary team



Reflect on current capabilities and practices



Inform priorities for the initiative and understand progress/changes overtime

# What is the PhmCAT?

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*The PhmCAT is comprised of 50-questions across 8 domains that are critical for population health management in primary care.*

- Leadership & culture
- Business case for PHM
- Technology & data infrastructure
- Empanelment & access
- Care teams
- Patient-centered, population-based care
- Behavioral health
- Social health

# Why Develop This Assessment Tool?

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## Prioritize Practice Support

- Get a sense of where practices most need help & where to start
- Bring a team of people together to develop a common language & framework for what changes they're being asked to make & what progress looks like
- Capture progress over time - administered annually (5 times) throughout the EPT program

## Tool for Evaluation & Learning

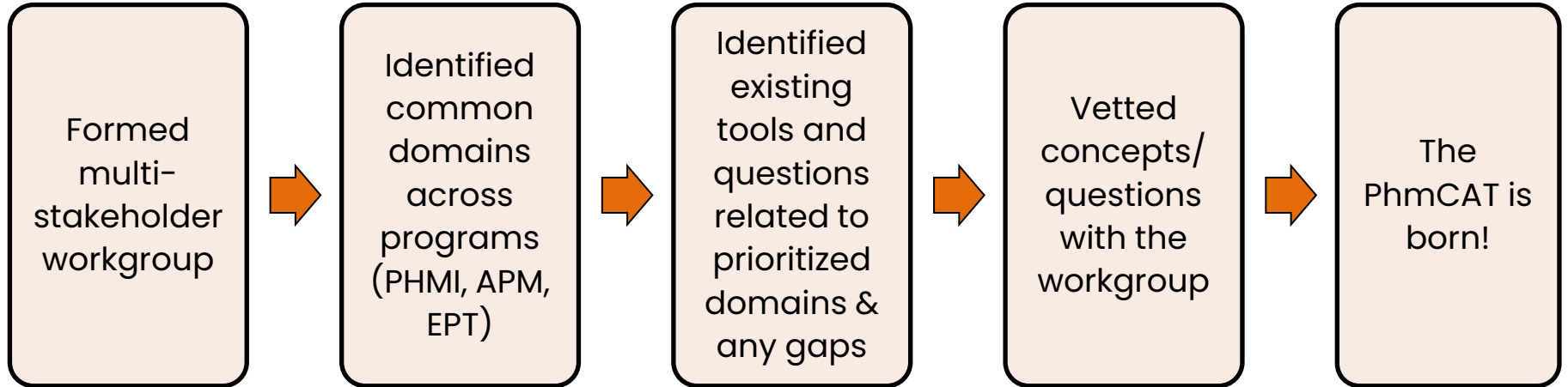
- Understand how practices build capacity over the course of the program
- Learn which areas practice make the most progress in and which are harder to improve

## Support for Building the Field

- Organizes key changes across multiple programs & keeps practices focused on shared domains
- Minimizes burden for practices participating in multiple programs

# How was the PhmCAT Developed?

*The PhmCAT was developed by a collaborative state-wide workgroup. A majority of the questions come from established tools in the field that correlate with improvements in population health management capabilities and outcomes.*

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# Who Needs to Complete the PhmCAT?

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All practices must have 3 roles represented in their response:

- 1 Provider
- 1 Clinic front-line (MA or Nurse)
- 1 administrative/office manager

Practices that also have the following roles should include PhmCAT responses from those individuals as well:

- Executive Sponsor (e.g., CEO, COO)
- Clinical lead (e.g., CMO, CNO, medical director)
- Finance lead (e.g., CFO, accounting manager)
- Data & technology lead (e.g., CIO, IT director, etc.)
- Quality lead (e.g., quality manager/director)

# Completing the PhmCAT

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- Practices can access the PhmCAT at [www.takethephmcat.com](http://www.takethephmcat.com) starting Friday, March 15<sup>th</sup>
- This URL is password protected and you will receive it in an e-mail
- Responders can then go to this URL, enter the password, and complete the PhmCAT by 11:59pm PST on April 30<sup>th</sup>
- The PhmCAT should be completed individually
- It is important to set aside dedicated time to complete the assessment (we estimate it will take up to 1 hour)



# For Practices Who Have Recently Taken the PhmCAT

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- If your practice completed the PhmCAT in the fall of 2023 as part of the application or planning for EPT or as part of the PHMI cohort, you can submit these same responses
- Before you do so, please review the responses for accuracy, make updates as appropriate, and then enter the responses into the survey tool
- For the May 1st submission, at least three people (and up to eight) from your practice need to complete the PhmCAT independently

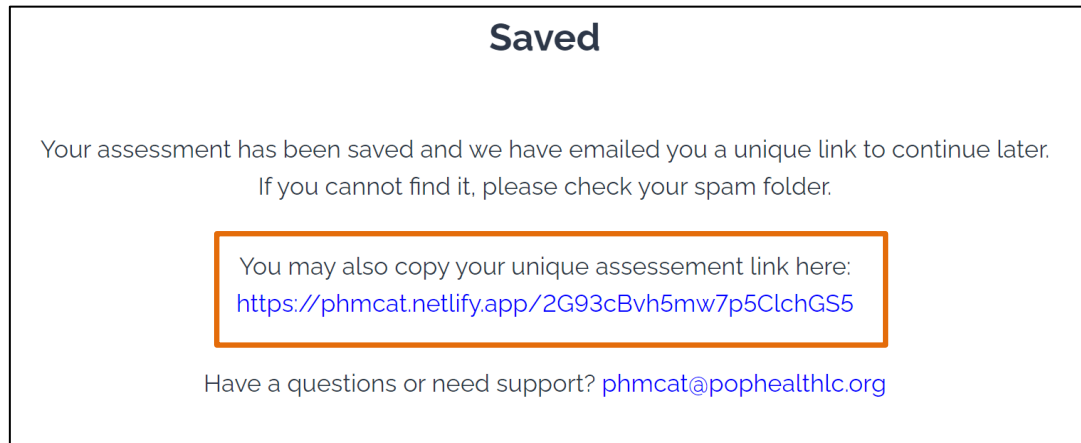
# Saving the PhmCAT

*Respondents can save their progress on the PhmCAT and complete it over multiple sessions. At the bottom of each page is an option to “Save for Later.”*

**Step 1.** Select “Save for Later”

**Step 2.** You will see confirmation that your assessment progress has been saved.

**Step 3.** Copy the unique assessment link on the confirmation page OR check your e-mail (your unique assessment link is also sent to the e-mail you entered on the first page of the assessment from noreply@takethephmcat.com)

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**Step 1.** When you've completed all 50 questions, select Submit.

**Step 2.** You will see confirmation that your assessment has been submitted.
